# **Costs Lawyer Standards Board**

# 1.1 Focus and Objectives for 2011

The objective of the CLSB is for it to be **fit for purpose** and fully operative by 31 October 2011 very latest. This will enable the ACL to delegate its function as approved regulator of Costs Lawyers, at which point it will then be for the CLSB to ensure **regulatory compliance** thus providing consumer protection.

The following sets out what has been put in place and what yet remains to be done to ensure this happens. The CLSB's priority is to define procedures for both **pro-active regulation** and **re-active regulation**. Further, the CLSB will continue with its programme of **communication** via the Costs Journal, by attendance at events and the National Conference. It will continue to build **working relationships** with the ACL, LSB, LeO and other approved regulators.

Regulation will be outcomes focused based on what the consumer expects. Risks will be identified, if these cannot be eliminated by interventions they will be managed appropriately and monitored.

# 1.2 Re-active Regulation

It is proposed both a Conduct Committee and Conduct Appeals Committee will be established to deal with disciplinary issues. Consultation on this proposal and four key governance documents (Code of Conduct, Practising Rules, Training & CPD Rules, Disciplinary Rules) will end Friday 8 July 2011 after which the consultation responses will be considered and an application filed with the LSB for approval of proposed governance documentation.

# 1.3 Pro-active Regulation

The CLSB will look at ways of obtaining information in relation to risks and other information from Costs Lawyers to enable it to fully understand its regulated community and meet LSB expectations. The CLSB will investigate the possibility of a "kite mark" for use by Costs Lawyers on their letterheads, compliment slips and business cards to increase customer awareness and confidence in the profession. The CLSB will look into further ways of bringing Law Costs Draftsmen into the regulated community and will work with the ACL on lobbying for the drafting of a Bill of Costs to become a reserved legal activity.
